


# Searching the Follett Destiny Library Catalog & Creating a Personal Resource List

1. Open Chrome or Safari
2. Go to : [library.jerichoschools.org](http://library.jerichoschools.org) (Don't add www.)
3. Click on George A. Jackson Elementary School.  
(You should see a sunflower.)




4. Click Log In - in the blue bar at the top of the page.
5. Use the "Log in using your Destiny account option."  
Type your 5 digit ID number in BOTH boxes.  
ID # is your lunch number.

6. Click Catalog in the blue bar at the top.



7. Click **Destiny Discover** on the left side menu.

8. This will open the Destiny Discover window.
9. Use the Search bar to find books on your reading level.  
Example..... type "Level S" (inside quotation marks)  
and click the Search button.
11. The results will appear on the next screen.

14. Click the Favorite button if you think you'd like to read it.
